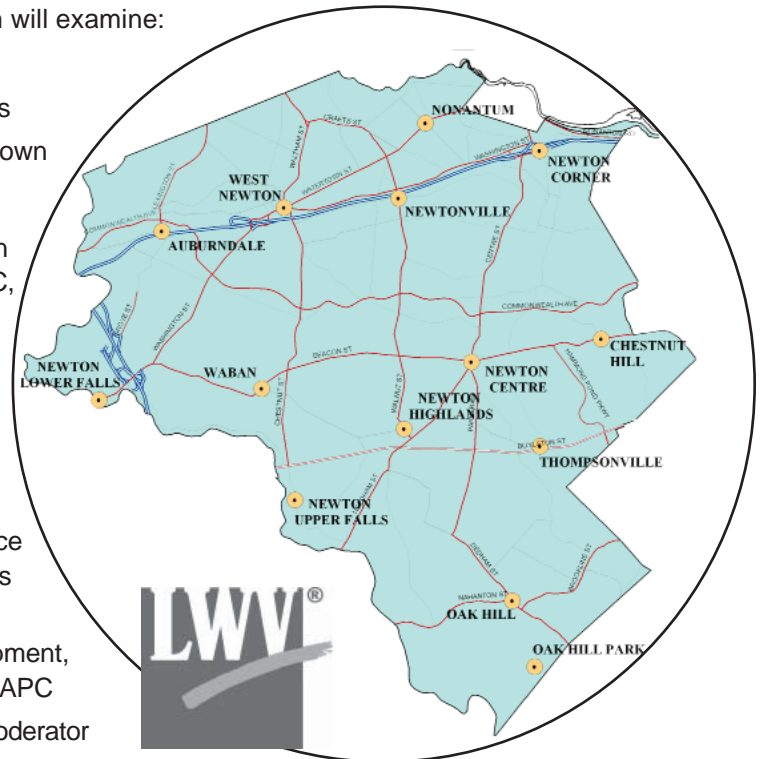
League of Women Voters Transportation Forum The Future of Transportation in Newton
